From the Director,

September is the beginning of the year on the Jewish calendar, the academic calendar and the Y's calendar.

This year New Beginnings will open for lunch and programs on Sunday, September 10, as part of the Riverdale Y's Annual Open House. Older Adult Center Programs will include a Jewish genealogy workshop by Rabbi Scott, dancing with Juan Ortega, and a special brunch for new members. Older Adult Center members who come on this day will be able to take advantage of fitness assessments, open swim, and demonstration classes at the Y. If you wish to participate in the Open House you will need to register in person on September 10, 2023 or on-line at https://www.riverdaley.org/event/2023_openhouse/.

We have filled staff vacancies including hiring new drivers, but now my focus is on the kitchen. Nekiya, our Head Cook, will be the only experienced staff member in the kitchen while her two key support staff members are simultaneously on medical leave and jury duty. We may need to make last minute menu changes, cater some meals, and hold off on resuming daily soup until we are fully staffed. We appreciate your patience and support during the next month.

Nutrition Lecture on Protein: A Guide for Optimal Aging

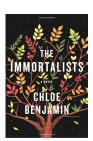
