LETTER FROM THE DIRECTOR



All our staff are available for consultation if you have a problem, but Social Workers are especially trained to help. We have three Social Workers connected with our program. Carmen Lopez is our part-time Older Adult Center Social

Worker. She is on staff to help you with benefits and entitlements, next phase planning, short-term counseling, and/or to lend an ear in a crisis.

Lucy Hoffman is the Social Worker for Safe at Home: Hudson Community Project. She works with homebound older adults in Riverdale in much the same way Carmen works with on-site members. Additionally, Lucy's program oversees subsidized housekeeping services for older adults. Lucy has office hours at the Y as part of our UJA partnership.

Finally, we host a Social Worker as part of an on-site geriatric mental health clinic, administered by JASA and NYC Aging. Please join me in welcoming Karl Custer, our new JASA Mental Health Clinician. In addition to Karl's social work training and experience with older adults, Karl has a background in creative arts.

Karl will be at the Y on Mondays and Fridays. He'll lead our Monday Group Chat and will be getting to know our Center and the membership in the next few weeks. If you are considering seeing Karl for ongoing therapy, either he or Carmen will need to refer you to the clinic for an intake. New Beginnings members are prioritized in the event of a waiting list.

Jeff Newman, our previous JASA Mental Health Clinician, left the Y and is now working full-time from JASA's main office. He will be missed but continues to work with some of our members off-site.
