LETTER FROM THE DIRECTOR



The City's executive budget has been released and now the City Council will meet to restore or add additional funding into the budget. Every year, I take a group of members to City Hall to advocate for our share of the NYC budget. This year, in addition to our regular advocacy, we need to advocate for continued recognition of some of our long-time members.

NYC Aging recently informed us that persons who live in Yonkers need to be deleted from our database and should not attend lunch, participate in any programs, or receive any services from New Beginnings. These are approximately 40 people, many of whom are at the Y daily and some who have been members for over 20 years.

Obviously, we will continue to allow these members to join us at the Y. But, we need to advocate through a convoluted bureaucracy for recognition of these members since not recognizing them will affect our overall budget.

The Y is advocating with the NYC Department for the Aging, with our elected officials and via our Partners at the UJA Federation. We've already met with some of our Yonkers members and asked them to start advocating for themselves. Now, it's time for you to join in. Call 311, call your City and State representatives and let me know if you are interested in coming to advocacy day at City Hall on May 15. I need to double check date.

Hope you enjoy this month's programs.
