A LETTER FROM THE DIRECTOR

Dear New Beginnings Member,

October is a short month for us with a series of closures on Thursdays and Fridays due to Jewish Holidays. The Jewish Holidays are late this year because there is a "leap" month added to the lunar Jewish calendar. Make sure to check when we are open before coming for lunch and activities. And, be sure to celebrate with us at our Rosh Hashanah Luncheon and later in the month in our Sukkah.

Older Adult Centers are periodically asked to circulate announcements from City, State and Federal sources. Here are a few important ones:

Starting October 1, 2024 U.S. households will be eligible to order 4 free COVID-19 tests at COVIDTests.gov. The COVID-19 Tests will detect current COVID-19 variants and can be used through the end of the year. If you need help ordering tests, staff can help.

If you are a NYC Homeowner, you can order official NYC Trash bins, you can visit www.bins.nyc or by calling 1-855-NYC-BINS. Secured rodent-proof bins will be required for properties with 1 -9 residential units effective November 12, 2024. Early Voting Starts on October 26, 2024. Remember that the Y is an early voting site in Riverdale.

Remember, if you need help accessing COVID tests, ordering bins, registering to vote or accessing any government service, we have staff that can help.

Medicare Open Enrollment Period

Medicare's Open Enrollment Period takes place this year from October 15, 2024 through December 7, 2024. This is your once-a-year opportunity to review your current Medicare health plan and prescription drug coverage and compare it to other alternatives.
